

Looking Glass Foundation – 2025 Reflections Scholarship

Frequently Asked Questions:

1. **I'm a permanent resident of BC, but I go to university in another province. Can I still apply?**

Yes! Students who are from BC and who are enrolled in an accredited post-secondary institution in Canada are welcome to apply. Due to Looking Glass' mission to support BC individuals and families, we do not accept applications from non-BC residents.

2. **Do I need to show proof of BC permanent residency? What documents are required?**

Yes, applicants must provide confirmation of BC permanent residency. Acceptable documents include a valid **BC Driver's License, BC Identification Card (BC ID), or BC Services Card.**

Please note that only a copy of one of these three documents will be accepted as proof of residency. If you don't have one of these documents, you can apply for or renew them through the [Service BC website](#). Please check Service BC for current processing times.

3. **What if I have never received support for my eating disorder?**

We do require confirmation of having received some sort of support for an eating disorder. This could be from a doctor, nurse, therapist, dietitian, or other professional who has supported your recovery – you do not need to have gone through an inpatient program to be eligible. Confirmation should be provided as a written letter.

If you haven't received clinical support for your eating disorder but have actively participated in any of the Looking Glass programs for 1+ years, we will also accept that as meeting this requirement. Please send us an email at scholarship@lookingglassbc.com letting us know if this is the case or if you have any other questions related to this requirement.

4. **Do I have to be recovered to apply?**

We understand that recovery can be defined in many ways therefore we do not require applicants to be fully recovered before applying, however, applicants should be far enough along in their recovery to be able to meet the demands of their chosen program. We strongly encourage you to reflect on your readiness for education and urge you to ensure that you

are accessing all the support you need as you go through your degree or chosen academic program.

5. I'm a mature student. Is there an age limit?

No. As long as you are enrolled in full-time undergraduate studies and this is your first undergraduate degree, you are eligible to apply!

6. How come graduate student and students entering secondary bachelor's degree studies are excluded from applying?

We recognize that graduate students and students entering secondary bachelor's degrees still face debt, but we also recognize that students entering a Master, PhD, or second bachelor's program have access to greater experience and expertise – especially when it comes to submitting essays and applications. Narrowing the field to first-degree undergraduates keeps the competition fair.

7. How long do previous winners have to wait before they can reapply?

Previous winners are not eligible to apply. While we know that each semester presents new debt and new challenges for all students, our goal is to celebrate and support different students every year.

8. If I can't enroll in classes yet, how can I supply the verification of full-time enrollment?

We understand that many students do not register for courses until the summer. For this reason, we ask that you include a copy of your acceptance letter or an official email/letter from Admissions as part of your application submission.

Once you have enrolled in courses, please send us a copy of your official course schedule at scholarship@lookingglassbc.com to confirm your full-time student status. This document must be issued by your accredited post-secondary institution and clearly list all your enrolled courses.

If you have already registered for courses at the time of your application, you may upload your course schedule in the designated field on the application form.

Please note: Applicants who do not verify their full-time student status by the application deadline will not be considered eligible.

9. I'm struggling to start my Personal Statement on Recovery and Future Pathways essay – can you help?

Sometimes the best advice is: *just start!* Put together a draft, and then show it to someone who is a strong writer or has experience with applications and ask for constructive feedback. Revise.

And remember: Your academic goals and eating disorder experience is 100% unique. This is an opportunity to highlight your strengths, courage, resiliency, and ambition to pursue education. Embrace your identity outside of the ED and think about the things that deepen your recovery!
